Captains Elections

- * Following the assembly, children from Years 2 to 6 will vote with staff having one vote also.
- * Successfully elected children will be announced at Presentation Evening.
- * The ballot paper order will be drawn from a hat.
- * Staff vote is equivalent to student vote ie staff vote = 1 vote only.
- * SRC representatives to be chosen Term 1 2015.

The <u>School Swimming Scheme</u> for 2014 begins on *Monday 27 October* and concludes on *Friday 7 November*. There are ten days of instruction.

Each participant will need:

\$2.10 each day for pool entry. (Please do not send any money before Monday, 27.

- swimming costume
- towel
- goggles (optional)
- sturdy bag for storing wet gear
- sun screen
- hat
- water

We will be walking to and from the pool for each session. Students will not be able to purchase from the pool canteen.

Students should ensure that they have clothing appropriate for the weather on each day. Most swimming lessons are conducted in the heated indoor pool.

If any student is unable to swim 25m confidently in deep water unaided and has not received a permission note, additional notes are available from the school photocopy room.
