Principals Report Week 6

Last Friday one of our parents organised for our flag pole to be fixed. With the help of the Asplundh crew, we were able to rethread the rope which has been missing for up to 18 months. This is very timely as we were able to celebrate Remembrance Day with the respect and dignity it deserves. Thanks to our parents for also assisting us to successfully relocating the two kangaroos in our back playground.





On Monday, two new flagpoles were erected at the same site as our current flag pole. Soon we will be able to fly not only the Australian flag but also the NSW and Aboriginal flags.

A Remembrance Day Ceremony was conducted at the site of the flag pole on Tuesday 11 November at 11am. The Ode and a minutes silence were observed with all classes in attendance around the flag pole.

The 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month attained a special significance in the post-war years. The moment when hostilities ceased on the Western Front became universally associated with the remembrance of those who had died. In 1997, Governor-General Sir William Deane issued a

proclamation formally declaring 11 November to be Remembrance Day, urging all Australians to observe one minute's silence at 11 am on 11 November each year to remember those who died or suffered for Australia's cause in all wars and armed conflicts.







University of Wollongong Science Fair

On the 5th of November, 9 students from Wollondilly went to the 2014 science fair at the University of Wollongong.

There were over 800 students and over 500 projects. They were all fantastic and a lot of hard work had been put in to get them to that standard.

Each student had 4 to 5 judges come round and give them questions to answer. Then you got a score out of 35, which would later be judged against the other students.

2C






