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## Goulburn Student Takes Regional Spelling Title

Goulburn North Primary School student Audrey Paul took first place in the junior regional finals for the Premier's Spelling Bee 2016. She will now go on to represent the region and compete at the state final in November, held at the ABC Centre in Sydney. Audrey along with a number of students from Goulburn's primary schools competed for the Regional title held on 19 September at Burrawang Public School. Goulburn competitors included Cathal Carragher and Ely Webb-Crothers (Tirranna), Mae O'Flynn and Frey Joseph (Wollondilly), Natalie Jones (North Goulburn), Tom Hayes (Bradfordville) and Abbie Dalglish and Madison Rebbeck (Goulburn West). For her achievement, Audrey also won a Macquarie Dictionary and a subscription for her school to Macquarie Dictionary Online.

Some 50 students from schools throughout the Southern Tablelands, Southern Highlands and South Coast participated in the regional competition. The Premier's Spelling Bee, organised by the NSW Department of Education, is an annual event introduced in 2004 as a fun and educational activity to engage students in spelling and promote improved literacy.

This week we have been looking at ways to combat bullying in schools. One of our strategies is to begin the discussion with our children around what bullying is and what it looks like. We have also reactivated the **"Bully Box"** in Primary end of the school. This gives our students another opportunity to voice their concerns and to communicate what is happening to them. The response from our 3-6 classrooms has been positive. Thanks to Mrs Woodberry for painting and repairing our bully box. It can be located beside the lost property box in Primary.

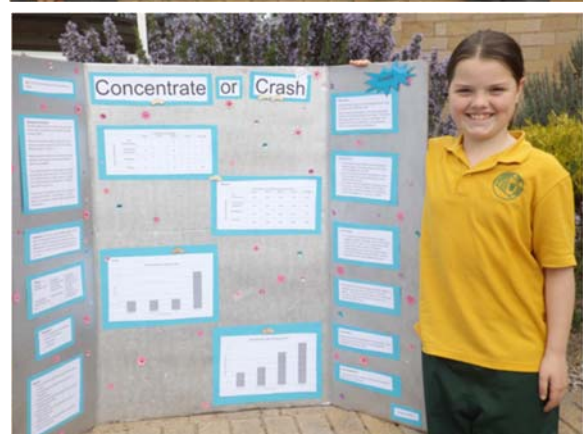
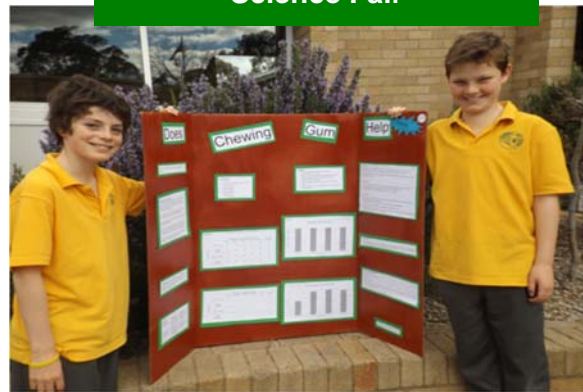

## 1/2N and Thelma the Unicorn

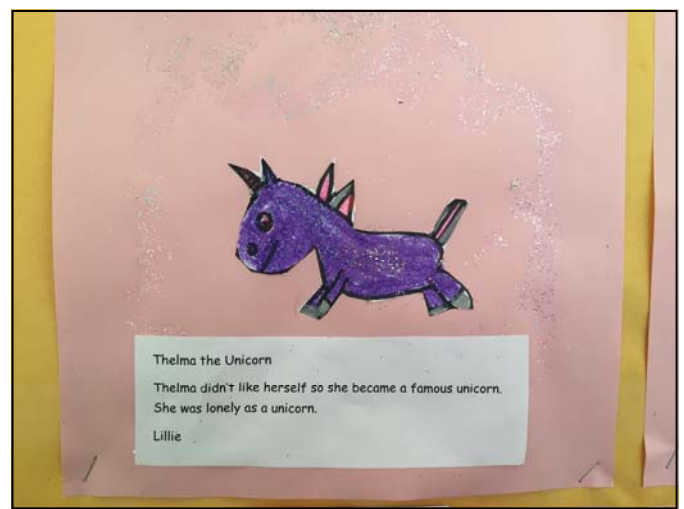
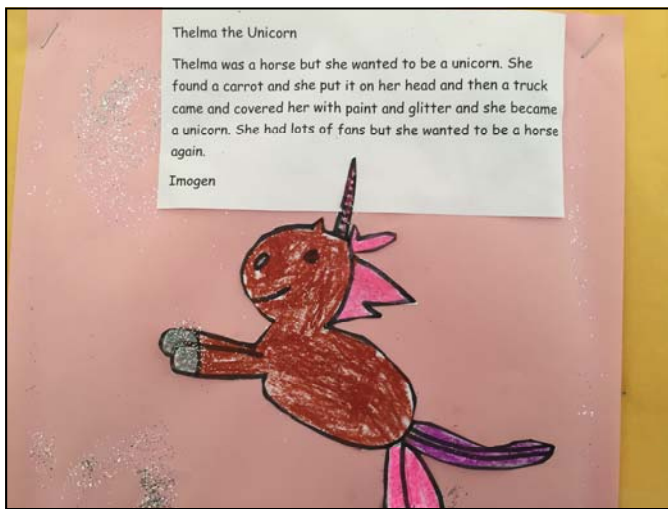
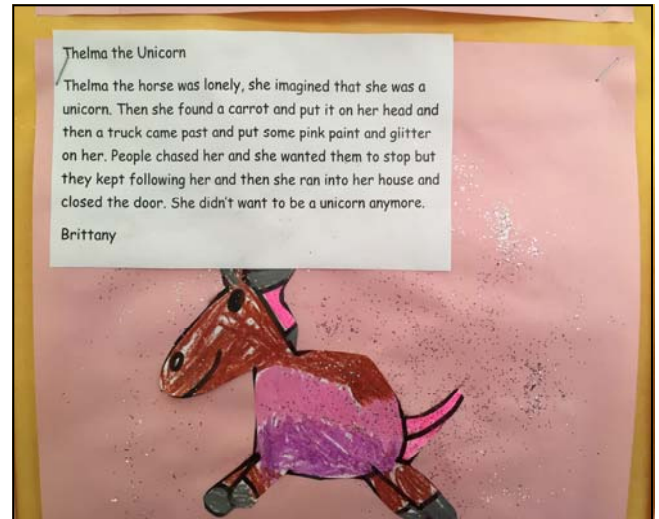
1/2N have been reading Aaron Blabey's books this term. He's become our favourite author!
