

Is the survey anonymous? Yes. We won't collect any information to link you with your responses


Who are we? The National Allergy Strategy. Our aim is to improve how allergies are managed in Australia



Orientation Dates

Students will spend the whole session in the Kindergarten classrooms. Please bring a packed lunch, drink and hat to this session.

Best Start Kindergarten Assessments will take place at our school in Term 1. It is very important to emphasise that the *Best Start Kindergarten Assessment* is not a test. Its purpose is to help the teacher gather information to guide the teaching of your child. You will be given feedback about what your child's teacher has learned about your child, which you are welcome to discuss if you wish, in keeping with our usual practice.

Ryder and Kayd Kingsford

Our racing season started in February and finished with the Australian Titles in October. The boys train on the bike two afternoons plus one day a weekend if there not racing and two times a week at the gym.

They completed in the Victoria Junior Motocross Titles which consist of 4 rounds and a lot of travelling with the closest round being 10 hours away. We also completed in the NSW Junior Motocross Titles that were also over 4 rounds and once again took us travelling around the state. Last of all the big one of the year, the one they train hard all year for the Australian Junior Motocross Championships. This year the week-long event took us to Renmark SA.

There were 586 riders with international riders also in attendance. Both boys having to qualify in their class to be able to complete for the champion. Ryder had over seventy riders in both his classes and Kayd's class had over sixty with only forty riders making it through to the finals. Their rode amazingly well all week to walk away with some great results.

Here are the results from all the events.

Ryder

Vic titles 2nd in 85cc A grade class and 2nd in 65cc A grade NSW titles state champ with 1st in 65cc 9/12yrs class and 4th in 85cc 9/12yrs class

Aussie titles 2nd in 65cc 9/11yrs class and 11th in 85cc 9/12yrs after a few little mishaps but rode fantastically well.

Kayd

Vic titles State Champ with 1st in 50cc 7/8yrs class NSW titles State Champ with 1st 50cc 7/8yrs class Aussie titles 2nd in 50cc 7/8yrs and 18th in 65cc 7/8yrs class after two unfortunate crashes and not gained any points in one of his races still rode an awesome race.

Mum, Dad and Wollondilly couldn't be prouder of them.
